Because of its impermeable, elastic and fire retardant properties, it is used widely for sealing containers, fishing equipment and domestic applications. In ancient Greece, cork was used in foot wear, to manufacture a type of sandals attached to the foot by straps. In the second century AD, Greek physician Diascorides, noted several medical applications of cork, mainly for hair loss treatment. Cork is an excellent gasket material. Some carburetor float bowl gaskets are made of cork, for example cork is also an essential element in the production of cricket balls and badminton shuttle cocks. In musical Instruments, particularly, woodwind instruments, it is used to fasten together segments of the instruments. Cork is moisture resistant and so it is used as an alternative to leather in handbags, wallets and other fashion items. Many racing bicycles have their handle bars wrapped in cork based tape manufactured in a variety of colours.
